Hilda and Vic were married on October 16, 1947. Their union was blessed with three children, two daughters and a son. Hilda was always very involved in farm life. She and Vic spent many long hours working side-by-side tending to their mixed farm operation. Hilda greatly enjoyed socializing with the neighbours at local dances and card parties. Life on the farm was filled with many blessings and plenty of good times. In the late 1960s, Hilda began working at the Eaton's order office in Humboldt where she made many lifelong friends. In 1979, she and Vic purchased a home in Humboldt and retired. Hilda joined the staff at St. Mary's Villa, where she truly enjoyed the work and the residents that she served. In 2007, she and Vic moved to a condo in Kinsmen Court in Humboldt. Again, they made many lasting friendships.
