In 1982, Keith and "G" decided on a career change and a move, and they purchased the café back in LeRoy. Two years later, they sold the café and he began work with the LeRoy Co-op. He worked there for several years, and later took a job with Sask Wheat Pool in LeRoy. Keith was such a versatile, hard worker; he literally could do any kind of job and do it well! Even while working full time, he still managed to help several local farmers put crops in, help with harvest, and tinker on equipment, etc. Keith was simply a handy guy and great to have around. He was currently employed by Sinnett Pork Farm as a maintenance technician and truck driver. Keith served his community as a town counsellor for 26 years. He was also a member of the volunteer fire department, caretaker of the curling rink, coached minor hockey and, later on, was the "trainer"

for his beloved LeRoy Braves. At present, he was also the self-appointed "welcoming committee" for the new immigrants to LeRoy. He became a father/grandfather figure to all of them and he loved, and was so proud, to be involved in their lives. Keith also has numerous friends throughout the community with whom he shared many fishing trips, hunting excursions, golf tournaments and men's nights with. He loved going to Kipabiskau with his family to do much of the same things. Keith was the one you went to when you needed to change your hook, untangle your line, filet the fish, or drive the boat; he would take care of everyone and likely went many hours without his own line in the water because he was too busy assisting everyone else. Keith absolutely loved to tinker in his garage, which served as the community tool depot and "fix it" shop for many of his friends and family. Keith is survived by his wife of 42 years, **GERIANNE** (nee Eaton) Dale; one daughter, two sons, and five grandchildren: **Brucie** (Jay McGrath) and their sons **Mitchell** and **Matthew**; **Kyle** (Carey Lubkiwski) and their sons **Maddux** and **Hudson**; and **Drew** (Sarah Stolz) and their daughter **Brielle**; two brothers and one sister: **Lyonel**, **Connie** (Mike Johb), and **Wayne** (Kathy Massop), sister-in-law **Vivian Dale**; and by numerous nieces, nephews, uncles, aunts and cousins. something beautiful remains.


