*Allie was born on July 2, 1924 to Alan and Jessie Haggard on the family farm north of Quill Lake, SK. She was the fourth of six children -- three girls and three boys. Allie was the last survivor of these siblings. She was raised on the farm and went to Selkirk School for nine years. At field meets, she usually came in first or second in most events that she entered. Allie loved all sports was excellent at both ball and curling. In 1943, her parents moved into Quill Lake where she completed her grades 10 and 11. She met Horatio Hartley and married in 1944. They moved to the Hartley farm yard and lived with his parents, Les and May Hartley. During these early years, Allie played on the Ladies Quill Lake Monarchettes ball team. They attended many sports days in the surrounding districts and were the team to beat. During the winters, she curled as often as time would allow, keeping this sport even after she moved to Saskatoon, playing each week in the Sutherland Ladies afternoon league. From 1945 to 1967, Allie was a switchboard operator for her father at The Quill Lake and District Telephone Company. Between shifts at the telephone exchange, she helped Horatio on the farm. When the telephone company was bought out by SaskTel, she obtained employment at the local hospital until it closed in 1969. Allie moved to Saskatoon, where she worked in Sherbrooke Community Center from 1970 to 1989. She was able to retire in 1989. Allie lived in her own home in the Sutherland Trailer Park until 2005, when she moved to the Palisades apartment building. In 2012, due to poor health, she moved to Mary's Care Home for a short time before she was admitted into the Saskatoon Convalescent Home. In October 2013, she moved to Sherbrooke Community Center.*

*Allie was predeceased by her husband Horatio; brothers: Cloyd, Verle and Jim Haggard; sisters: Ethel Barnard and Irene Wolff; sisters-in-law: Norma and Eunice Haggard; brothers-in-law: Leo Spitzig, Lewis Barnard, Evard Grey, Don Schloendorf, and Herman Wolff; nephews: Larry Haggard and Lorne Haggard; and by her niece, Elsie Haggard. Allie is lovingly remembered by her two children and their families: Trudy (Bob) Payton and family, Natasha (Randy) Woytowich and their daughter Shyla, and Ward Payton, all of Saskatoon; and Byron (Lynne) Hartley and family, Terra, and Nicole (Mike) Kiem and their daughters Kaitlyn and Alexis, all of Calgary, AB; sister-in-law, Cathy Haggard of Medicine Hat, AB; and by numerous nieces and nephews and cousins.*
