Brian was born on July 23, 1956, to Gordon and Lydia (nee Lebold) Laybourne, at Watson, SK, where he also attended school. Farm chores kept him busy; milking cows, cleaning barns, picking stumps and rocks and haying. His first job away from home, at the age of 16, was as a gas jockey at B&W Esso Service in Watson, SK. On August 17, 1974, Brian married Regina Gabriel at the Holy Guardian Angels Catholic Church in Englefeld, SK. Brian was then employed trenching phone lines and building pole sheds at Watson, SK. In August of 1976 he was accepted into Police College and upon graduation, was employed by the Moose Jaw City Police Department for 5 years. In 1981, Brian moved his family back to the home farm south of Watson to farm with his brother Ray, and he continued to work for the Watson Municipal Police for another 14 years. In 1995 he retired from the police service to farm full time. Brian's hobbies included fishing, hunting and gun collecting. He loved to read and watch programs about war, history and world affairs. Brian served as the President of the Watson gun club for many years and was affiliated with the Wildlife Federation. More recently he served as a director for the Midway CO-OP and as an advocate for the Quill Lake Floods Organization. Brian and Regina were always kept busy with the farm, their church, the community and the activities of their kids and grandkids.
