He attended Trojan School until about grade 8 and then took up farming with his father and oldest brother Wilfrid. In 1953, he married Therese Tremel and together they started a new farmstead east of Peterson. It was there that they raised a family of five children. Laurent ran a mixed farm raising cattle, hogs, chickens, and turkeys, along with growing various grains. He was a progressive and innovative farmer often being the first in the district to try different farming methods and seeding different crops. He developed into a master builder. He started with a very basic project, building an outhouse, which then evolved into building granaries, an arched-rib barn, and whatever else needed to be built. During his retirement years, he started doing the most intricate and complicated woodworking projects. Laurent and Therese did some traveling to various destinations in Canada and the United States. Later on, the only traveling they did was to the junction to have coffee with friends and drive around to see what the boys were up to. Laurent also took up gardening, producing massive crops of various vegetables. He also enjoyed camping and fishing and indulged in those hobbies as often as he could.
