Footprints

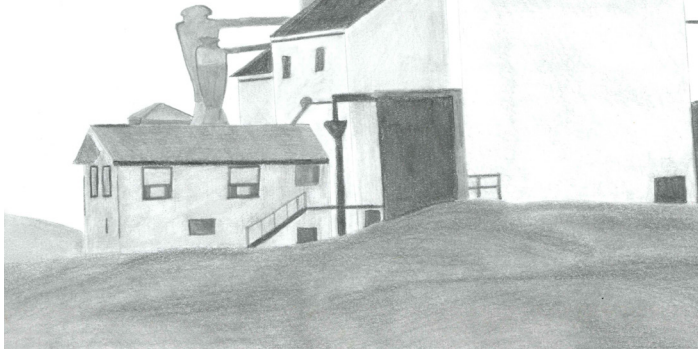
One night a man had a dream.
