Monica, the youngest of nine children, was born on February 2, 1943, to Frank Sr. and Theresia (nee Wachtler) Schweighardt in Aka, Hungary. Born during WWII, Monica's earliest years were a story of great difficulty. Surviving the War and the tumultuous years that followed, Monica eventually came to Canada in 1950 with her mother and her five surviving siblings (her father and oldest brother died in the war). The family built their home in Humboldt, SK with the generous help of the Emmerich and Juliana Zimmer family and the Sisters of St. Elizabeth. Monica attended kindergarten in East Germany, Grade 1 in Austria, grades 1-8 at St. Augustine's in Humboldt, grade 9 at Humboldt Collegiate and grades 10-12 at the St. Ursuline's Academy in Bruno, SK. She worked as a young adult at Eaton's and at St. Mary's Villa in Humboldt. Monica married David Nordick on July 6, 1965, at St. Augustine's RC Church in Humboldt, SK. They made their home on a farm near Englefeld, SK, where they raised their two daughters, Helen and Judy. As well as being a busy homemaker, Monica worked side-by-side with her beloved husband on the farm until 2008, when they moved to Humboldt, SK. Monica was a member of C.W.L. and Pro Life, and she enjoyed sewing, gardening, flowers and many artistic crafts. In more recent years she especially enjoyed fishing and travelling with her dear husband. Her travelling highlight was a trip with her brothers and sisters to Hungary, where she finally saw the home where she was born and she was able to visit the grave site of the father she never knew. Her greatest joy was spending time with her grandchildren, family and friends, and all who knew Monica will forever remember her for her kindness, her loving generosity, and her warm smiles and hugs.
