He grew up there and attended Tilly School until grade seven, then helped his dad on the farm. That was very difficult work, since breaking land was done with oxen and then horses until finally a tractor was bought which made it easier. Camille spent the winters working in logging camps, hauling logs and pulp in British Columbia, Manitoba and Ontario. He also trucked across the northern prairies, and did some custom combining in the United States. After that, he decided to make farming his life. On October 25, 1969, Camille married Caroline (nee Roenspies) Schultz, and they farmed and lived in Annaheim. Camille enjoyed life on the farm; so much time was spent making improvements on the yard and farm. Summers were spent travelling to visit family and friends. In June of 1994, Camille and Caroline moved into Humboldt, but Camille continued to go out to the farm to give a hand when needed. He believed we are here for a purpose and we are to use our God-given talents; Camille accomplished that by volunteering within the community, including the Good Neighbor Store and helping his neighbors. Camille enjoyed doing carpentry or working on anything to keep himself busy. Faith in God, their neighbors and their community, and being with his children and grandchildren were his life. Camille was a special person to all and we will miss his smile, his warmth, and his gentleness.
