He attained his elementary education at Rose Bush and Iron Spring rural schools, and his secondary education at Sacred Heart High School. After graduating, Leo worked in construction, and then as a partner with Schmid Industries and Four Brothers. Eventually, he went on his own as Schmid Industries, where he built cabinets and church pews until his retirement in 2009. Over the years, Leo was a member of the Watson Chamber of Commerce, the Sacred Heart Parish Council, and the Knights of Columbus, both with the 3rd. Degree Watson Council and the 4th. Degree Abbot Severin Gertken Assembly. In addition, he pursued his interests in woodworking, stained glass, researching local history, hockey, and "going to coffee row". Although he did take a couple of trips to visit family, he much preferred staying in Watson, his favorite corner of the world.

Leo is survived by three sisters and five brothers: Dolores Castello of Waukesha, WI, Daniel Schmid (Gladys Brown) of Meadow Lake, SK, Gerald (Judy) Schmid and David (Judy) Schmid, all of Watson, Edward (Patricia) Schmid of Harrison Hot Springs, BC, and Edith (Larry) Kwasnacia, Marianne Schmid (Paul Humenny), and Leonard Schmid, all of Watson; 23 nieces and nephews; 36 great-nieces-and-nephews; two great-great-nieces-and-nephews; two aunts: Agnes Gerspacher and Louise Knafelc, both of Watson; and by numerous cousins.
