After completing his education, David moved to Port Clements, BC, where he entered a Heavy Duty Diesel Mechanic apprenticeship. On November 7, 1969, David married Joan Hillyard of Port Clements and they had four children. David bought a gravel truck and backhoe and started his own business. In 2006, he moved back home to Saskatchewan.
