Munkler farm until 1946 when they bought their own farm where they built a new house. Art and Hedy lived on their farm until 1975 when they built a new home and moved into St. Gregor. During their retirement, they loved to travel and enjoyed their cabin at Barrier Lake where there were many happy family times with children and grandchildren. In 2001, they moved to their condo in Humboldt. Art passed away on April 18, 2003. Hedy continued to reside in the condo until moving to St. Mary's Villa in 2014. She extended her hospitality to everyone and there were always those delicious buns to enjoy. She enjoyed her garden and was well known for her beautiful flower beds and well-manicured yard.
