Henry, the youngest of six children, was born to George and Mary (nee Stinka) Kenaschuk at Hamer's Nursing Home in Watson on April 25, 1935. He attended Green Meadow School and Watson High School. Following his education, Henry farmed with his father, and his oldest brother John. In his early years, after every harvest, he worked as a desk clerk at the Patricia Hotel in Saskatoon, SK. On October 29, 1960, Henry married Marlene Hicks at 3rd Avenue United Church in Saskatoon. That spring they moved to the farm in the Daphne district and lived with Henry's father. Farming was his passion and he continued to do so with his son Kelly until 2002, when he and Marlene moved into Watson. Henry enjoyed spending time with friends and family, especially watching his grandchildren in their sports and activities. His interests included curling, bowling, fishing, camping, weekly card nights with “the boys”, and times travelling with special friends, Ken and Lavina Fetter. Henry spent all of his life in the Watson and Daphne area. He was a member of the Independent Order of Forresters, served on the Trinity United Church board, and the Cemetery Association. Henry was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease and lived at home until 2015, when he became a resident of Quill Plains Centennial Lodge.
