



He was a big fan of country music, and was so excited in the past few years to finally attend the Craven Country Jamboree! He was also a big sports fan, and closely followed the Riders and Blue Jays. Ed had a dry sense of humour and a great laugh. He loved "the big surprise" and would keep his plans a secret until just the right moment, when he would nonchalantly say something like "I arranged an underground tour of the (PotashCorp Lanigan) potash mine this afternoon!"
