A step on the road to home.*

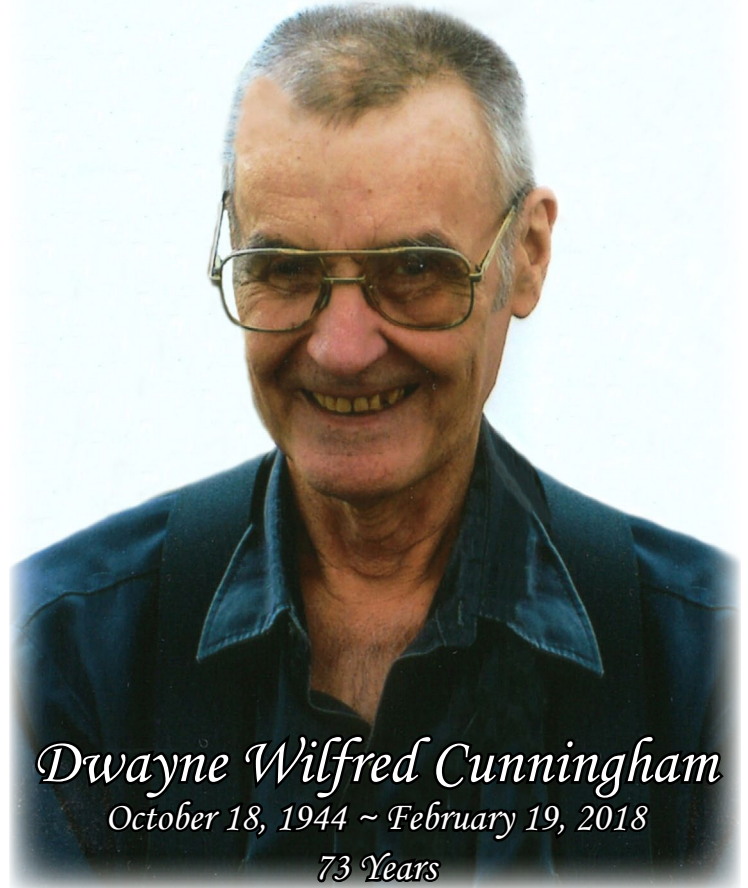
