That at harvest must come home".

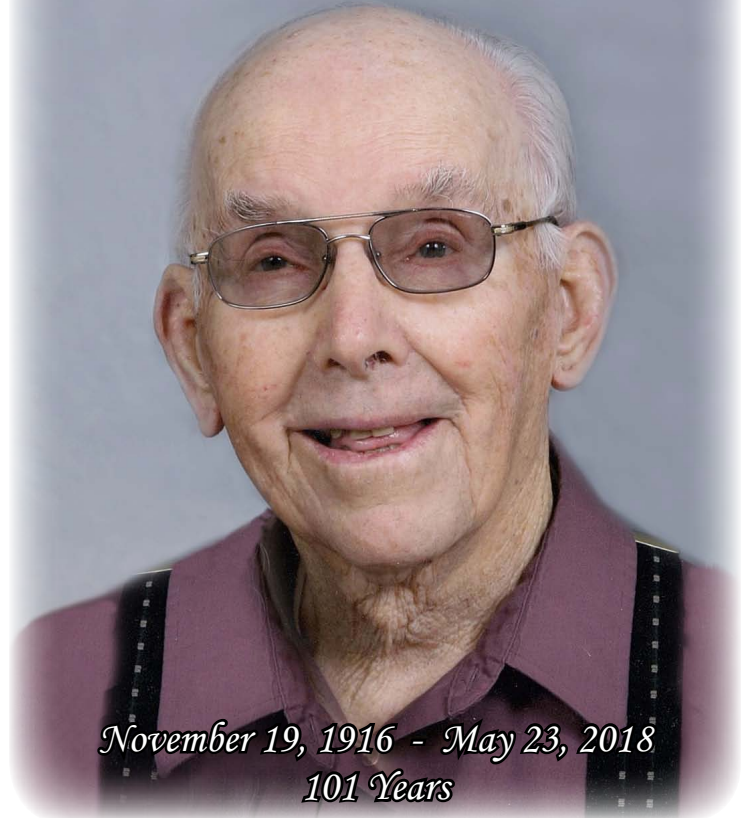
