She quite often said how she looked forward to, and enjoyed, her Mother and Daughters weekends. Although her life was complete with Alex and the girls, her love didn't stop there. Hilda always spoke of how very special her sons-in-law, Kevin, Glen and Kim were to her and how much she loved them. In her words she wrote, "They are always helping me out, even without my asking. May God take care of them for me."

Hilda will forever hold her grandchildren deep within her heart. **Chad** was unique in Grandma's eyes. She loved that Chad always took the time to reach out to her to show his love for her. Grandma loved reading Chad's messages and watching videos of him, his pets and his business. She would watch them over and over again. Grandma always said what a hard worker Chad is. She was so very proud of him and his accomplishments. Grandma was always Chad's number one fan! **Brittany** filled Grandma's heart with pride. Grandma was so proud of everything that Brittany accomplished in her career and her travels. She loved Brittany's free spirit.
