Des, the oldest of seven children, was born on August 21, 1935, to Mike and Agnes (nee Lopinski) Borstmayer in Cudworth, SK. He was raised on a farm near Leofeld until 1940 when Mike sold the farm and bought the current Borstmayer farm located three miles east of St. James. Des attended Hat Creek School and later St. Peter's College, followed by the University of Saskatchewan, where he graduated from the College of Vocational Agriculture in 1955. On October 9, 1956, Des married Lori Brinkman in Lake Lenore. For the first winter after their marriage, Des and Lori worked in Hamilton, Ontario, returning to the Borstmayer farm where they would live for the next 47 years. It was there they raised a family of four, three boys and one girl. In the early years, Des and Lori raised livestock, milked cows, and grain farmed. Things were tight, but in 1968 they managed to build a new house on the farm, complete with running water and a forced air furnace, a real treat from that of the old house. In 2003, Des and Lori moved to Humboldt, when their oldest son Tom returned from

Australia to take over the family farm. Des loved farming and watching the crops as they matured. In the summer you could often see Des walking through his fields, so much that Lori use to tease Des that he would get better crops if he did not trample half of it checking the crop so much. Even after moving from the farm Des spent many a day at the farm until his health would no longer allow it. Des loved socializing and playing cards with friends and family and enjoyed all kinds of sports including baseball, hockey and golf.
