And the joyful we all shared.*

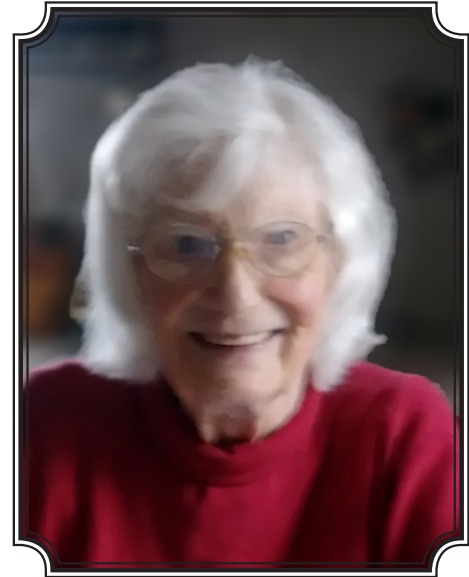
*So as we travel on through life

After graduating from high school in Duck Lake, SK, Lea attended Teachers College in Saskatoon. Upon receiving her Teachers Certificate, she taught in various locations in Saskatchewan, including two years on First Nations reserves in Northern Saskatchewan, Dilke, and finally in Prud'homme in 1955. It was there she met Auguste Hannotte and, on July 21, 1956, they were married. Lea retired from teaching to become a fulltime farm wife and mother. Lea and August were blessed with four sons: Raymond (1957), Jerome (1959), Roland (1962), and Louis (1965). Lea was an amazing mother, incredible cook, and wonderful homemaker. Memories of simple but delicious food will always remain with her family, such as scratch angel food cakes and the best tourtieres; she reluctantly divulged her cooking secrets. Auguste passed away on August 17, 2004. Lea happily remained on the farm with Louis until her passing. Always of great importance to Lea was her strong faith in God, which influenced her children and grandchildren. She was ready for the end of this life and prepared for "eternity beyond".
