When Edna was three years old, the family moved to St. Benedict, SK, where Edna grew up and completed her education. After high school, Edna worked at a store in St. Benedict, which proved to be good preparation for her married life. As a young woman, Edna loved to curl and play ball. It was at one of these games that she met her future husband. Edna married Herman on July 2, 1951 and they had more than 66 years together. Edna and Herman were blessed with four children: Murray, Kathy, Shirley, and Floyd. For most of their married life, they lived in Fulda, SK, where they owned and operated Lueke's General Store until they retired in 1995. Edna loved to garden, play ball, curl, pick berries, go for Sunday drives, cross country ski, sew, knit, crochet, and create plastic canvas decorations, and go for walks on summer evenings. Everyone looked forward to the special homemade ornaments they received from her at Christmas, and the beautiful afghans she made for her children and grandchildren. The stockpile of dishcloths she knitted should last the family a lifetime. She loved traveling with Herman and over the years they went to Barbados, Germany, Arizona, California, Florida, Calgary, and Vancouver Island. Many of these trips involved special times with their children and grandchildren. Edna was a community minded woman and always willing to lend a hand, and this included making many trips to pick up necessary supplies for events. An active volunteer, her later years were spent crocheting blankets for the Guardian Angels and donating countless Angel Food cakes and dishcloths to the Fulda bingos. Edna cherished the many hours spent visiting with friends. Most of all, Edna had a kind heart and she loved her family dearly. She was very proud to have a deepfreeze full of baking for her grandchildren's visits. In April 2017, Edna and Herman moved to Caleb Village in Humboldt and by August 2017 Edna moved to St. Mary's Villa where she was very happy and she loved when visitors stopped by for a chat. She participated in many of the activities and especially appreciated attending Mass there; she was a woman of strong faith.
