Gone from our sight - but never our memories

Gone from our touch - but never our hearts

Belle will be lovingly remembered by her five children and their spouses: Wendell (Joyce) Mullet, Rebecca Kennel, Dan (Barb) Mullet, Lina (Rob) McDonald, and Mary Ann (Keith) Hatchard; 10 grandchildren; 11 great-grandchildren; and by one sister, Nellie Mishler. She was predeceased by her husband, Jim Mullet; son-in-law, Galen Kennel; parents, Levi and Nettie (nee Sharp) Kauffman; and by 10 siblings.

Belle, as she was affectionately known, was born to Levi and Nettie (nee Sharp) Kauffman on October 5, 1927 in Coalridge, Montana. She was one of 12 children. Her father was a Mennonite pastor. He was originally from Huntsville, Ohio, and her mother was from Garden City, Missouri. On June 4, 1948, Belle married James Mullet in Bloomfield, Montana. They had five children: Wendell, Rebecca, Dan, Lina, and Mary Ann. In 1962, Belle, Jim and their children moved to an acreage near Guernsey, Saskatchewan, where Jim became the pastor at Sharon Mennonite Church. Belle always had a big garden, preserving the abundance for winter eating. When most of her family had left home, she completed a correspondence course from Guelph University, Ontario, and got a degree in horticulture. For years she supplied the surrounding area with bedding plants and flower baskets. Belle also taught kindergarten at the school in Guernsey and drove school bus. She and Jim were both involved in producing honey from their beehives and maintaining a large yard of fruit trees and ornamentals. After they retired, they went south to Brownsville, Texas, every year where Jim was the part-time pastor for Paul's RV Park. There they enjoyed day trips into Mexico, volunteering with the Audubon Society, with housing projects for the local church, and being with other retirees. In 2006, they bought a condo in Drake, SK, and moved there. Belle always had a book on hand to read, as well as participating in a reading program at the school. She made quilts for her children and grandchildren, and unique clothes for them to wear. In 2013, Belle fell and broke her hip and never returned home. Jim died on October 31, 2013, and Belle moved to the Rosthern Mennonite Nursing Home in December of that year, her home until her death.
