Doris was a proficient and busy homemaker who loved cooking, and always had sufficient food for her family and anyone who would stop by. As well, she helped with the field work on the farm and tended to the animals. Doris had "garden hands", which was very evident as she always had the best garden in her neighborhood. Eventually, she and Tony moved into Humboldt. Doris became a full-time bus driver for over 20 years, retiring when she was 65. Over the years, she enjoyed playing cards with her family, especially on special occasions when they all got together; 10 Step was a favorite game. She derived her greatest pleasure from watching her children, then her grandchildren and great-grandchildren play sports, particularly ball. Doris was a very spiritual person and attended Mass regularly until her health deteriorated. She suffered with dementia during the last few years which sadly took over her life, even though she fought a strong battle.
