Barbara Thiel was born September 5, 1941 to George and Marie (née Furstenburg) Dobmeier at the Wilkes Nursing Home in Watson, SK. She grew up on a farm north of Englefeld, SK and attended Chelton School. She went to work at a young age, doing domestic work and caring for the children of several farm families. Barbara married Theodore Thiel in 1961 at St. Martin's country church, east of Annaheim, SK. They made their home on a farm north of Bruno, SK and welcomed a son, Clinton, into their lives in 1965. Her husband died in a tragic farm accident later that year and Barbara moved to Bruno with her son. She remained in Bruno until 2017 when, due to declining health, she moved to St. Mary's Villa in Humboldt, SK. Some of her favorite pastimes were gardening, crocheting, sewing, and visiting, as well as taking part in a good card game with friends. . . , which of course, always included a cup of coffee and some goodies. She also enjoyed watching sports on TV, particularly hockey and baseball. Known for her generous spirit, this was often expressed through her gift of hospitality. Barbara spent many hours sewing, making quilts and quilt covers. She enjoyed children and babysat several children, on a regular basis, over a number of years. After her move to the Villa, Barbara soon came to love and appreciate the staff that cared for her and accepted it as her new home. Barbara is lovingly remembered by her son, Clinton Thiel, of Bruno, SK; her sister, Rita Omelchuk of Yorkton, SK; her sister-in-law, Susan Dobmeier of Humboldt, SK; as well as her nieces and nephews.
