From there, the family relocated to a farm near Archerwill and Peter attended Marneau Lake School. He and his brothers farmed the homestead at Archerwill until 1975, when they moved into Humboldt. Since the Eberl family was new in town, Sr. Cecelia Klassen, OSE, was a very helpful, kind and supportive friend and guided them through numerous difficult times. They were very appreciative of her. Peter worked for the Sisters under Home Care for about four years. He was then employed at St. Elizabeth's Convent doing maintenance work for seven years. A talented jack-of-all trades, he enjoyed doing odd jobs. After retiring, Peter still worked at some of the Sisters' houses and for other people in Humboldt as well. A fan of country music, Peter especially enjoyed listening to Wilf Carter. Christianity was of utmost importance to him; he was a man of very strong faith and attended Mass regularly.
