On October 24, 1956, Jim married Catherine "Katie" Sterner at St. James. They began their life together on the Meyers' homestead where they farmed and raised a family of three, two sons and one daughter. In 1982, Jim and Katie retired into Humboldt. Jim's favorite pastimes were visiting with family and friends, the annual camping trip, fishing, hunting, painting, going on casino bus trips with Katie, and driving around in the countryside. Katie passed away on March 12, 2003. During the last two years, Jim has resided at St. Mary's Villa.
